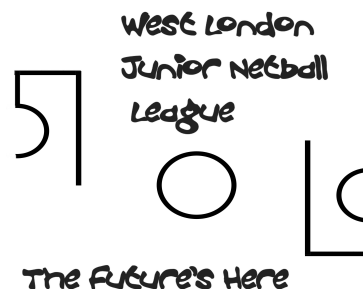

New Partnership!

The West London Junior Netball League was launched in December 2005 through the support of the London Active Partnership, Active Ealing Sports Development team and England Netball. The league, which is affiliated with England Netball, is played at a central venue within the borough of Ealing and is open to all teams or groups from across the West London area. We currently have three age groups playing U12, U14 and U16's

This Season we have taken the exciting step of merging with the Queensmead Netball League. Queensmead Netball League is run and organised by a committee of dedicated volunteers and by pooling the resources of the West London Junior Netball League, which has established itself over the past 5 years, with this well developed adult league has numerous benefits.

A few examples –

- A clear development pathway for girls to continue playing into adult netball
- Improved support and opportunity for established adult teams, affiliated with the Queensmead League, to develop Junior sides should they currently not have them
- Pooling of resources from both leagues
- All the benefits of the Junior League, experienced by teams so far and the expertise of those associated with the Queensmead League
- More efficient use of organisers time as many volunteers double up with both leagues

We would like to invite you to join us for the 2009/10 season, which will be held at Reynolds Sports Centre (Acton High School), with our exciting new format.

Based upon our experience over the past 4 years and feedback from the teams who taken part we will be holding a netball series. This series will involve festival style fixtures on 6 Sunday's throughout the 2009/20 season

Benefits of a series festival competition –

- 1) Due to increasing opportunities in netball, and sport and leisure in general, this places less pressure on players and coaches volunteer time throughout the season
- 2) Allows for a high level competition, lots of games, great experience of the festival atmosphere and lots of playing time
- 3) Offers great value for money
- 4) Opportunity for teams to attend as many of the dates as possible of simply try taster events for newly formed teams

Team Eligibility

The League Series competition will be split into 4 age groups:

U 12 (Likely to be in School years 6/7)

U 14 (likely to be in school years 8/9)

U 16 (Likely to be in School Years 10/11)

Players are able to play up an age group if they wish

Event Format

Festival events will take place on the following dates

Sunday 29th November 10 – 4 p.m.

Sunday 24th January 10 – 4 p.m.

Sunday 28th February 10 – 4 p.m.

Sunday 21st March 10 – 4 p.m.

Sunday 25th April 10 – 4 p.m.

Sunday 23rd May 10 – 4 p.m.

Each day will consist of a league round robin festival format with all teams playing each team within their age group at least once. At the end of the league format team positions will be calculated based the points scoring system in the rules below.

Each team will be allocated points for their finishing position for that festival, which will be carried forward to their total across all of the above events. At the end of the last event in the series, held in May, all points will be added from the previous finishing positions of previously attended festival dates with an overall league winner and runner up announced.

Teams who commit to 3 or more of the above series festival dates will be entitled to nominate one of their players for a Jack Petchey achievers award, which comes with a cash contribution towards the club for which the player represents

(Calculates at £2.50 per girl for an average squad of 10 players)

Money covers officials costs, court hire and medals. Money to be paid in advance to the West London Junior Netball League

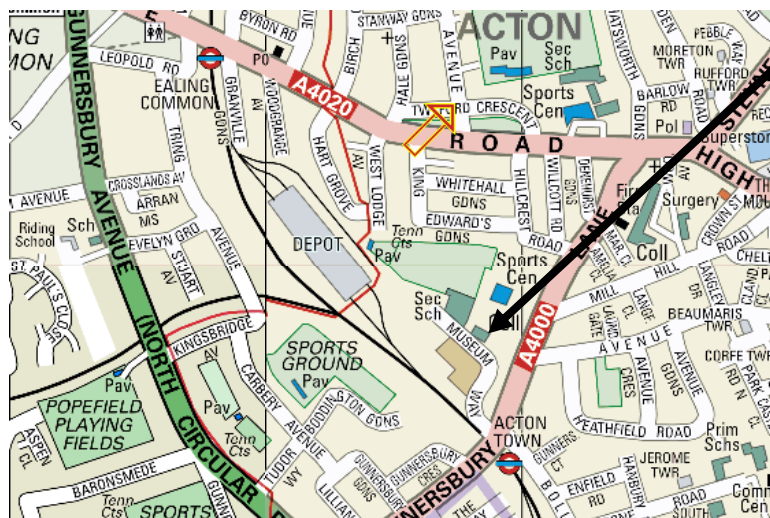

Fair Play Charter

- Team managers are encouraged to promote Fair Play and the associated ideals to all participants.
- The following guidelines form the basic criteria against which the event organiser and sports officials will be examining individuals, teams, managers and spectators before awarding their nomination for the fair play award.
- Being a good sport
- Good behaviour on and off the pitch/court
- The fair treatment of all other players
- Acceptance of victory and defeat
- Respect of officials and their decisions
- The co-operation and team work of players, coaches and supporters
- Examples of actions that will be recognised under the fair play charter:
- Having a calm and controlled temper
- The appreciation and recognition of good play in opposing teams as well as your own
- The encouragement and not criticism of players
- Thanking of officials and opposing players
- Playing by the rules and acceptance of the officials decision
- Using the correct and proper language at all times
- Adherence to competition rules and code of conduct
